PROJECT DESCRIPTION: An Administrative Use Permit application to establish a truck terminal in 2 phases over 5 years. Phase 1 to be completed in 3 years will include a 1,440-square-foot mobile office, 225-square-foot guard shack, and 72 parking spaces for 72 trucks and 72 trailers. Phase 2 to be completed within 5 years will include a 15,000-square-foot office, shop, and warehouse. The mobile office will be removed in the second phase. Existing buildings will be demolished in Phase 1. The site has direct access from N. Newton Road, with one driveway proposed. Water service will be provided by California Water Service. A private onsite septic system for wastewater, and an infiltration basin for storm water are proposed. There is an existing wireless communication site on the parcel. This parcel is not under Williamson Act contract.

The Property is zoned I-L (Limited Industrial) and the General Plan designation is I/L (Limited Industrial).

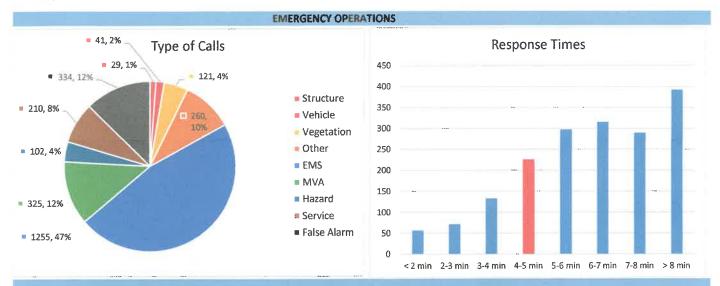


Incident Density Map

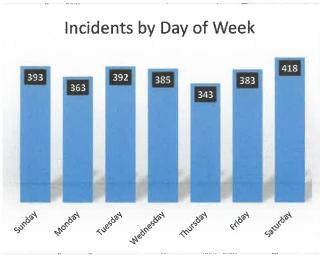

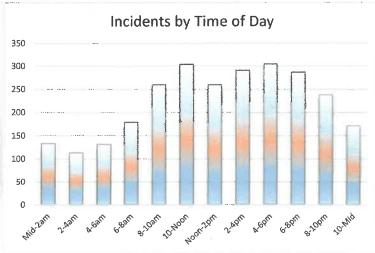

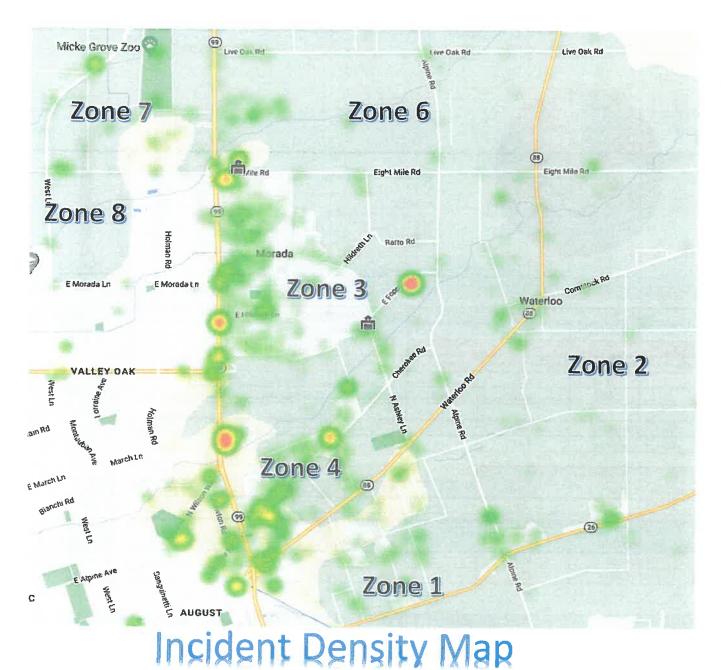
