PROJECT DESCRIPTION: A Time Extension application for previously approved Site Approval to expand an existing trailer manufacturing facility in 2 phases over 5 years. Phase 1 is the construction of a 6,400-square-foot metal building for sand blasting trailers with building permits to be issued within 18 months. Phase 2 is the construction of a 36,000-square-foot metal warehouse building for the storage of equipment with building permits to be issued in 60 months. These parcels are not under a Williamson Act Contract. Parcel numbers 087-100-81 and 087-100-82 will be merged into 1 parcel.

With the original approval, building permits for Phase 1 improvements were to be issued within 18 months, and building permits for Phase 2 were to be issued within 5 years. If approved, this time extension will extend the entire project by 1 year, with 30 months to obtain building permits for Phase 1 improvements, and 6 years to obtain building permits for Phase 2 improvements. The new Phase 1 expiration date will be September 21, 2022, and the new Phase 2 expiration date will be March 22, 2026.

The Property is zoned I-L (Limited Industrial) and the General Plan designation is I/L (Limited Industrial).



Pezzi Road Bridge Replacement over Calaveras River Project Notice of Availability of Initial Study Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration

WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

San Joaquin County (County), in coordination with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), proposes to replace the Pezzi Road Bridge (Number 29C0199) and improve the approach roadway to the bridge. The bridge is located within an agricultural area in San Joaquin County, approximately 3 miles east of State Route 99 and north of the town of Waterloo. The purpose of the Project is to replace a functionally obsolete bridge in order to enhance safety on Pezzi Road by eliminating the two ninety-degree curves in the road and providing a consistent 50 miles per hour roadway facility over the Calaveras River. The County has prepared an Initial Study with Proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration which examines potential environmental impacts caused by the proposed project.

WHY THIS PUBLIC NOTICE?

The County has studied the effects this project may have on the environment. The studies within the Initial Study with Proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration show it would not significantly affect the quality of the environment. This notice is to advise you that the preparation of this report has been completed and is available for you to review.

An Initial Study with Proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared and is available for public review beginning October 28th, 2021 through December 1st, 2021. 

 - CIP Committee found that Diede's Bid was closer to what the RFP called for, opposed to Robbelen bid had items that maybe were on the higher end.
 - As far as creativity and innovation Robbelen hit the ball out of the Park from the design and expanded upon the RFP to include items that were not asked for. Robbelen's response to questions and interviews were better. Whereas Diede pretty much designed a square box, with the knowledge that would change once the district meets with them.
 - Contractors were rated on the following category: Personnel, Approach to providing the requested scope of Services, Price Proposal and Innovative and or Creativity.
 - Overall Score: Robbelen scored 90.02 % and Diede scored 85.86 %
 - Difference in price of \$280,055 Diede is the lowest bid of \$1,305,500
 - Board President Clay Titus recognized the proposals were 25% higher than original anticipated, could be
 due to material cost and or overhead cost (staffing). Clay believes that if the project was of a higher
 magnitude, than Robbelen would be his pick for the project, but the District project is not of that magnitude.
 - Board Members John Baker and Joe Murphy had some concerns with lowest bid and potential for Change Order (s). Joe Murphy asked both Contractors ,What would cause a change order?, response from Diede was that it would be owner driven, Robbelen believed that they couldn't see a change order, unless it was

due to an unforeseen reason, i.e. burial site. There is also a contingency cost in the contract.

- Contract is at 180 days and if District doesn't act quick enough it's a possibility that contingency could be Used up on increase prices.
- Chief Walder recommended that Kevin Moran be the Project Manager for the District, Joe Murphy agrees.
- Chief Walder will also extend the Use Permit at San Joaquin County Community Development, as the current permit is going to expire in November.
- Finance of Station 2 Option were presented to the Board WMFD Long Term Facilities Maintenance Plan 2021/2022
- This Fiscal Year the district will move \$200,000 into Facilities /Apparatus Fund
- Director Ryan Gresham recommended the district look at potential equity at Station 2 and or refinance, can the district get a better rate and a 15 year loan?
- President Titus, does not believe that postponing this project for a year, is to any benefit to the District, he
 only sees cost continue to rise. Director Baker agrees that we need to continue this project as promised to
 the community.
- Director Ralph Lucchetti, questioned removing one of the bays for cost savings. Joe Murphy nor Clay Titus believe this would be a cost savings, and then come back and try to retro fit the additional bay later on. Changing the design also would be of a safety concern for location of Office / Bathrooms to the Public.
- Chief Walder will send Contract to Legal for review and opinion.

DRAFT ANNUAL MEASURE N REPORT FY-2020/21

This report is the result of Waterloo Morada Rural County Fire Protection District Resolution 19-01

"A RESOLUTION ORDERING AN ELECTION, REQUESTING COUNTY ELECTIONS TO CONDUCT THE ELECTION, TO BE HELD IN THE WATERLOO-MORADA RURAL COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT ON MAY 7, 2019.

In Section 9 of the Resolution it states; "In accordance with Government Code Section 50075.1 et seq., the District's Fire Chief, as the chief fiscal officer of the District, shall file a report with the Board at least once a year, no later than January 1 of each year. The annual report shall contain both of the following: (a) the amount of funds collected and expended; and (b) the status of any project required or authorized to be funded with the proceeds of the special tax in accordance with this Section."

It should be noted that this required report was completed before the Districts FY-2020/21 Annual Audit. These figures are budgeted numbers and numbers received from San Joaquin County Reports that will be used by the Districts Auditor to complete the Districts annual audit.

OBJECTIVE

Conduct an evaluation of funds collected and expended relating to Measure N.

DESIRED OUTCOME

Create a document that transmits the information gathered in an effective manner so that all stakeholders of the District will have a sound understanding of the facts presented. It should be comprehensive and inclusive identifying the areas of revenues and expenditures presenting to the policy makers. It is the intent of this document to be transparent in our fiscal obligations to the community.

PROCESS

REPORT DETAILS

Report timeline is between July 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021

- Identify and confirm revenues collected in property tax by San Joaquin County Assessor
- Evaluate expenditures and record keeping
- Present to the Board of Directors for approval
- Publish a document and make it available to the public.



REVENUES GENERATED

The District, uses the San Joaquin County Tax Assessors office to collect our revenues.

- Measure N Revenues collected in 2020/21 fiscal year \$1,485,876
 - December allotment of assessed funds is 53% (\$787,514)
 - April allotment of assessed funds is 47% (\$698,362)

The Assessor's office charges a tax administration fee of 1% to provide this service.

BUDGET DEFICIT

The Waterloo Morada Fire District had made drastic reductions to expenses in the past and could no longer sustain those cuts. Therefore the operating deficit was included in the needs assessment of Measure N.

The operating expenses surpassed the revenues in the amount of \$225,593 as of June 30, 2020.

Measure N funds are being used to address the deficit.

STAFFING

The District added three Firefighter positions utilizing Measure N funds. This allows the District to staff the engine at Station 1 with 3 personnel, staffing at Station 1 can be reduced to 2 personnel minimum. Engine

2 located at station 2 is staffed with two personnel 24/7. Additionally, the District has a Battalion Chief on Duty 24/7 to provide supervision on a routine basis and command and control during emergencies.

Total cost for three Firefighters Salary and Benefits - \$358,565

New hire costs - \$21,469

APPARATUS

APPARATUS LOAN PAYMENTS

The District was in critical need of replacing outdated apparatus and purchased 2 units one Wildland Engine in 2016 and one Fire Engine in 2017.





The District utilizes measure N funds to pay for the debt service on both these fire engines which totals \$143,350. The new engine for Station 2 was ordered when Measure N was passed in 2019 and during the 2019-20 budget year the District used measure N funds to begin to equip the apparatus at a cost of \$21,806. This new engine's debt service will be accounted for in next year's Measure N report.


APPARATUS REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

The District earmarked during this budget year \$155,387 to fund the apparatus replacement program.




REOPEN FIRE STATION 2

\$544,847 of this fiscal year's Measure N funds have been used to purchase and operate the property that serves as Station 2 at 4946 E Eight Mile Road. This is a rural residential 4 bedroom home on 7 acres that is being used as a firefighter residence.



The site is perfect for the planned station expansion that includes a training ground, 2 bay apparatus room, office area, shop, and bathroom. The station is a work in progress and will be developed over the next few budget years as the Districts funding allows. This location has already provided an increase in service to our citizens with the average response time of 5 minutes 36 seconds in May 2021 compared to an average response time of 6 minutes 41 seconds in May of 2019. As you can see in the graphs below, although the Districts responses have increased our response times have decreased with a noticeable decrease in response times as noted in the below graphs.





REMODEL FIRE STATION 1



Fire Station 1 on Foppiano Lane was originally built in 1947. It has had several remodels and additions to it to bring it to where it is today. The station is in need of updating in the firefighter living quarters. With Covid -19 and other factors driving the need to change the currnet open dorm room into individual rooms for our firefighters. Currently the station houses the on duty crew of four including the Districts Battalion Chief. In addition to the on duty crew the Districts administrative offices are located at this station which includes the Administrative Secretary and the Fire Chief.

No Measure N funds have been expended during this reporting period on Station 1 projects. Plans to remodel the crews quarters are in the works and budgeted in the 2021/22 budget.

SUMMARY

The Waterloo Morada Fire District has served the residents of the district since 1947. Responsible for the protection of life and property within the District, WMFD responds to emergencies of all types including but not limited to all fires, emergency medical calls, vehicle accidents, flooding and hazardous material incidents. The District is active in the community and takes public education and prevention seriously interacting with our community at every opportunity. Measure N funding is critical to the ongoing effectiveness of District operations.


